

Williams Township Snow and Ice Regulations

This is meant to provide you with the information necessary to make everyone aware of the resident's role in helping to keep the Township's roads and sidewalks as safe as possible during winter conditions.

* According to Ordinance 2002-7, Section 1, parking on township roads is not permitted after the start of a snowfall or during any snow removal operation. Vehicles abandoned or parked on Township roads during snow removal will be towed at owner's expense.

* Ordinance 2002-7, Section 3, also states that residents or property owners are not permitted to dispose of any snow or ice from driveways, sidewalks, etc., onto Township roads.

* Removal of snow or ice from public sidewalks is the responsibility of the resident or property owner. According to Ordinance 2006-10, Section 4, snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within twenty four (24) hours after the snow, sleet, freezing rain, etc., has stopped. It must be placed on the property of the residence and not in the road or piled around a fire hydrant per Ordinance 2006-10, Section 5, and 2002-7, Section 3.

* Residents should wait until after streets have been plowed before removing snow from their driveways, if possible.

* When residents have fire hydrants on their property, they should clear snow from them as soon as possible or within (24) hours after the storm has stopped. Ordinance 2002-7, Section 4.

* Plowing crews hired by residents should haul snow from properties if it can't be piled up, and should not push snow into the street or onto neighboring properties.
