

## WILLIAMS TOWNSHIP FIRE COMPANY NO. 1 RECEIVES TWO PET O2 KITS

Your Williams Township Fire Company No. 1 has received a gracious donation of two Pet O2 kits from the Lehigh Valley County Animal Response Team (LVCART), [www.lvcart.com](http://www.lvcart.com).

The kits contain pet oxygen masks with a specifically designed cone shape in three sizes, small, medium and large that can be used on dogs, cats, ferrets, rabbits, guinea pigs, birds and more.

Far too many pets die each year of smoke asphyxiation. While firemen attempt to get pets out of burning structures, they are not able to revive them unless they have the proper equipment—pet oxygen masks. These specially designed masks can be used on both conscious and unconscious pets suffering from smoke inhalation or exposure to toxic fumes.


Nearly all fire fighters have seen people try to rush back into a burning building to save their pets, and most understand that pets are indeed beloved family members. With the right equipment, firefighters can often save a pet's life. Your fire company now has this equipment, thanks to LVCART. Please be aware that the Tax Office will be open for extended hours on:



## When Do I Call 911?



It still surprises me how many times we still hear that question. People call for many reasons and for the most part it is really necessary to utilize ambulance transport for that particular incident. Anytime you feel that the situation is beyond what you can either assist with or you feel that the situation warrants, please utilize the 911 system.



What you will get from Easton Emergency Squad is the highest trained emergency medical providers the system has to offer. The paramedics and EMT's of Easton Emergency Squad also have the state of the art equipment and vehicles. Currently we operate 7 Mobile Intensive Care Units (MICU) and one advance life support Quick Response Vehicle (Easton Medic 1) which can support our units and provide additional personnel and equipment.

We work in concert with Williams Township Volunteer Fire Department (WTVFD) routinely either assisting them at a scene or having them dispatched to help with patient care on a critical EMS call. Having a strong working relationship with the Fire Department is crucial especially in the rural environment that Williams Township affords. We continue to develop this and Easton Emergency Squad is grateful the WTVFD leadership supports the continued development of this interface.

Just a reminder that Easton Emergency Squad does offer a annual membership program to all Williams Township residents. Member's of the Easton Emergency Squad enjoy the peace of mind that in the event they utilize our services the bill for services will only be billed to their insurance and any unpaid portion will be written off to the patients membership. ## LOCAL NON-PROFIT TO HOLD BOOK DRIVE ON ELECTION DAY




Perhaps it is news to most of you that a successful non-profit made its start right here in Williams Township. Established to honor the memory of Judith Krug, longtime director of the American Library Association, Judith's Reading Room began its involvement with sharing the joy of reading in December, 2009. From its first shipment of books to recovering soldiers at Landstuhl Medical Center in Germany to its recent dedication of a library at the Children's Home of Easton, the volunteers at Judith's Reading Room have dedicated themselves to "freedom through literature".

To date, 34,000 books have been delivered to veterans, soldiers serving overseas, children's resource libraries, local schools, and many locations near and far where people have limited access to literature. This work continues through the efforts of people who periodically review their bookshelves to check for their gently used books, hard or soft cover, they no longer want. This is what we hope our Williams Township neighbors will do in the next few weeks before Election Day. The greatest need presently for Judith's Reading Room is children's books, so take advantage of the opportunity to get your children involved. Books for the troops are also welcome. We will have book donation boxes set up at all 4 voting locations on Tuesday, November 6. Please pack up a bag of books on your way to vote!

# SEWER ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

The Sewer Advisory Committee (SAC) is charged with making recommendations to the Township Manager and the Board of Supervisors in developing rates for public sewer customers and to make recommendations in regards to the budget for public sewer, customer billing, capital plan and budget, inflow and infiltration and repair and maintenance.

**IMPORTANT REMINDER FOR SEWER SYSTEM USERS:** It is extremely important for sewer system users to refrain from placing any objects other than toilet tissues into the toilet system. Materials other than the use of toilet tissues have caused an increase in expense for the cleaning of the sewer traps and will lead to costly repairs. Also, it is important to not put grease into the sink drains as this leads to clogging of the sewer lines, another unnecessary expense that impacts the Township budget. Please make every effort to abide by these guidelines.

Some of the past accomplishments of the Committee have been:

- Recommending and implementing a separate budget and financial tracking report for the public sewer service by removing all revenue and budget line items for public sewer service from the General Fund and creating a distinct Public Sewer Fund;
- Eliminating a 25% billing error rate for customers in the Northern District;
- Supporting the contract for maintenance of the pumping stations to Private Utility Enterprises for quality and expense reasons;
- Recommending an annual water usage appropriately adjusted for the Northern District and diversion meter usage to Easton Area Joint Sewer Authority (EAJSA). This resulted in a reduction of \$24,000 in an annual EAJSA expense;
- Requested the township engineer to conduct a reserve study to ensure sufficient funds will be available to replace pump station equipment at the end of its useful life; and
- Changed the sewer billing from a flat fee of \$125.00 per quarter to the bill being based on the amount of water usage by the homeowner which amounts to an average customer savings of \$50.00 per quarter.

The Committee is presently working on the following matters:

- Exploring the reason for the Cedar Park sewer rates being relatively high compared to other municipalities served by the EAJSA;
- Developing a policy for billing customers who clearly caused a problem such as grease buildup for the expense of correcting the problem;
- Developing a quarterly report more clearly showing the number of customers, water usage, billed and collected revenue by district and customer type; and
- Creating a list of capital improvement projects that will enhance the efficiency of the sewer system.

Remember the amount of your sewer bill is directly related to the amount of your water usage!


