

## Fall Leaf Collection



The Williams Township Public Works Department will be offering leaf collection services later this fall. The Township will announce on our website more specific information regarding dates and times services will be available to residents. Residents will be required to bag their leaves in bio-degradable bags. Bags are available for purchase at the Township Municipal office.

Residents will also have the option to drop off their leaves and yard waste at the Township Recycling Center located at 2300 Morgan Hill Road. The center is open to accept leaves and yard waste from 3:00 p.m. Friday through Sunday evening. As a reminder, the Township strongly encourages residents with larger properties to manage their leaf and yard waste using backyard composting methods.

## Williams Township's MS4 Program *How to Protect our Water Resources*

One of the goals of Williams Township's MS4 Program is to help raise awareness among residents and businesses regarding how their actions can impact storm water quality. The following information provides some important suggestions to assist the township in meeting our goal. Please take a few minutes to review the issues below and consider how each of us, working together, can help protect our precious water resources.

### Storm Water Runoff

Because storm water runoff is generated from land surfaces such as pavements, yards, driveways, parking lots and roofs, it is important to control storm water pollution. Certain activities and behaviors of individuals, households, and businesses can generate pollution from these surfaces. Some common behaviors that have the potential to generate storm water pollution are:



- 💧 **Landscaping and Lawn Care** - Lawns produce significant amounts of nutrient-rich storm water runoff. Research shows that such runoff from landscaping treatments can contaminate drinking water supplies with chemicals toxic to both humans and aquatic organisms.
- 💧 **Pest Control** - Pesticides in storm water runoff directly affect the health of aquatic organisms. Their presence in drinking water also threatens human health. Caution



needs to be used when using these products around your home and business.

- 💧 **Pet Waste Management** - When pet waste is improperly disposed of, it can be picked up by storm water runoff and washed into storm drains or nearby water bodies. Please make sure you clean up after your pets.
- 💧 **Car Washing** - Outdoor car washing that uses detergent-rich water flows down the street and into the storm drain.
- 💧 **Proper Disposal of Household Hazardous Waste** - Many products found in homes contain chemicals potentially harmful to both people and the environment. Please follow manufacture's suggestions when disposing of hazardous waste.

## Fry's Run Watershed Association

Fry's Run Park was the scene of several days of intense activity in July as Jim Wilson, Watershed Coordinator with the Northampton County Conservation District, coordinated the restoration of nearly 300 linear feet of severely eroded stream banks along Fry's Run. An excavator, a skid loader, over 100 tons of stone, more than 30 hemlock logs and a couple dozen rebar pins were used in the construction of the project. The project included grading back steeply eroded stream banks and constructing four log vane deflectors, two mud sill cribs and one stone deflector directly into the graded stream banks. The graded stream banks will reduce erosive energy on them during storms, and the structures now help protect and stabilize the stream banks by deflecting stream flow away from the banks, thus reducing stream bank erosion and subsequent sediment pollution to Fry's Run and the Delaware River. The stream bank structures also provide fish habitat.



The PA Fish & Boat Commission designed and supervised the project as part of its aquatic resource conservation mission. Labor was provided by the Conservation District and volunteers from the Fry's Run Watershed Association, Lehigh Valley Master Watershed Steward Program and the Northampton County Prison Work-Release Program.

Power and hand tools were provided by the Fish & Boat Commission and the County Parks Department.

All are invited to stop by the park, at the intersection of River Road and Royal Manor Road, for a look at the improved stream bank. A second phase of the project - planting of several hundred trees and shrubs along the stream bank - is slated for the future.

## Public Works Update

This Fall the old public works garage at Diehl and Morgan Hill Roads will be going through renovations to improve the site for the Township recycling center. About \$40,000.00 of a \$250,000.00 DEP grant will be used to make improvements at this location. We ask that all residents please be patient as we will be moving things around and improving the site for brush and leaves drop off as well as making an area for woodchips and mulch that the residents will be able to take for their use. New signage will be posted to help identify where items are to be dropped off. We will post any new updates and information on the Township website as things progress.

Throughout the year we get residents calling and asking who is responsible to maintain certain things. Here are a couple of reminders for property owners.

**Trees and bushes** – It is the property owner(s) responsibility to keep their trees and bushes trimmed back off the edge of the roadways. We periodically go around trimming along the roads and anything hanging out over the roadway will be trimmed.

**Drainage Pipes** – Driveway pipes are not maintained by the Township. Any drainage pipe under a private driveway is the responsibility of the property owner(s)

**Driveway site distance** – It is the property owner(s) responsibility to maintain the site distance they need for their driveway. The public works will cut the roadside two or three times a year but do not come out for any driveway issues.

**Winter snow storms** – Vehicles are not permitted to be parked on any public roadway in the Township during a snow storm. If a vehicle is parked on the roadway it will be towed. It is also a violation to throw or deposit any snow onto a public roadway. Please refer to Township Ordinance 2002-7 for further information.



Two applications totaling 77 acres are currently being processed. Both were approved by the county. We're waiting to hear about state funding. We hope to wrap them up soon.


The township has recently received another application of 70 acres that we've just started work on. These properties would bring the total preserved by the township to over 1160 acres.






